

**AMENDED  
FINAL SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN  
THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA  
AND  
METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND  
DAVIDSON COUNTY, TENNESSEE  
FOR STRUCTURAL CHANGES  
TO PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES,  
EXCLUDING SCHOOLS  
DJ# 204-71-43**

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, Tennessee ("Metropolitan Government" or "Government") and the United States Department of Justice ("Department of Justice" or "Department") previously entered into a Final Settlement Agreement in 2003, numbered DJ#204-71-43, as approved by Resolution No. RS2003-1481 of the Metropolitan Council ("Final Settlement Agreement"); and,

WHEREAS, the parties wish to continue their mutual compliance with the Final Settlement Agreement; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. Except as explicitly provided herein, the terms and conditions of the Final Settlement Agreement are incorporated herein by reference, and will continue in full force and effect.
2. This Amended Final Settlement Agreement shall not be binding on either party unless and until it has been signed by the parties' designated signatories and approved by the Metropolitan Council, but at such time, its Effective Date shall be June 1, 2006.

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3. This Amended Final Settlement Agreement will terminate when the parties agree that the Plan has been implemented, the expected results have been achieved, or there exists program accessibility to the programs, services, and activities of the Metropolitan Government other than the facilities that are controlled by the Metropolitan Board of Education, when the parties agree to supplant this Agreement with a subsequent agreement, or June 1, 2009, whichever comes first.
